About:

The workshop will provide a venue to discuss the relationship between language and the production of knowledge from a comparative transnational and European perspective.

Although scholarship is increasingly internationalised, connected, and oriented towards collaboration, it is also hierarchically structured in the economic and socio-political sense. These hierarchies point to inequalities at organizational, national, and international scales, which structure the process of cooperation between European centres and the Southeast European peripheries. During the workshop, we will consider how the process of Europeanization of the humanities and social sciences, and the hierarchies between European regions, open some avenues for research and collaboration, but foreclose others, shaping the limits of what kinds of knowledge about Southeast Europe can be recognized and supported as relevant.

We will also look at the place that the research of Southeast Europe has in different academic disciplines. We will inquire what methodological assumptions are considered as relevant, or even defined as trend-setting.
